



Subject: COLOMBIA MICROCREDIT STATUS REPORT

I am pleased to advise you that our Rotary microcredit project in Bogota, Colombia is proceeding nicely. Your Rotary Club was a co-sponsor

for this project, which was organized by the District 5150 Microcredit Committee. Our partner in Colombia is the Rotary Club of Bogota Centenario.

The operating agency Mencoldes has successfully established 16 Credit Groups in low-income communities throughout the Bogota metropolitan

area. These Credit Groups have an average of 5 to 8 people in each group. Ninety six poor people are now participating in this Rotary loan program.

The participants are families and individuals in vulnerable situations. Faced with a lack of job opportunities, they have become self-employed and

established their own microenterprises. Sixty one percent of the loan recipients are single women head of households. To support themselves

they are engaged in the following businesses, among others: making and selling clothing and decorative items, catalog sales, marketing beauty

products and services, and selling food, stationary and other supplies. One young woman is operating a nursery school which she wants to expand

with future loans.

So far \$45,400 in loans have been made to these 16 credit groups. These loans are being used by the low-income recipients to establish or support

their existing small businesses. As of the last report we received, all the loans are current in their payments. None of the loans were delinquent 30

days or more.

Thank you for giving these hard working people in Colombia an opportunity to improve their lives, through our Rotary microcredit loan program.



POLIO NEWS

Dear Club President:

We are pleased to announce that at the October 2013 Trustee meeting, the Trustees agreed to recognize clubs that give US\$1,500 or more to PolioPlus with a certificate of appreciation. The certificates will begin with this current Rotary Year and will continue through the duration of the End Polio Now: Make History Today campaign. We hope that your club has set a PolioPlus goal, in addition to its Annual Fund goal. We recognize that for some small clubs a goal of US\$1,500 may be difficult to attain, while other clubs can and should do more. Every dollar given to PolioPlus brings us closer to a polio-free world. On World Polio Day (24 October), in addition to club fundraisers held globally, Rotary hosted a special Livestream presentation – World Polio Day: Making History – to showcase the progress of the Global Polio Eradication Initiative (GPEI). Co-hosted by Rotary and the Northwestern University Center for Global Health, the 60-minute program took place before a live audience and streamed online to viewers worldwide. Since the livestream event, over

11,000

people from more than 50 countries have watched the event, which is available in English only. If you have not already done so, we encourage

you to watch the presentation, and share it with your club. The video makes a great club program during Foundation month. Now is the time to End Polio Now and Make History Today. If we successfully engage every Rotarian, we will change lives; we will realize our dream of eradicating polio forever.

Headlines

In the Middle East, a comprehensive outbreak response continues to be implemented across the region. Seven countries and territories are holding mass polio vaccination campaigns targeting 22 million children under the age of five years. In a joint resolution, all countries of the WHO Eastern Mediterranean Region have declared polio eradication to be an emergency, calling for support in negotiating and establishing access to those children who are currently unreached with polio vaccination. WHO and UNICEF are committed to working with all organizations and agencies providing humanitarian assistance to Syrians affected by the conflict. This includes vaccinating all Syrian

children no matter where they are, whether in government or contested areas, or outside Syria. In southern Afghanistan, the traditional endemic

region in the country, no WPV cases have been reported for one year. All nine cases in the country this year are from Eastern Region, linked

to cross-border transmission with Pakistan. For more, please click here.


